WORSHIP. Worship is our time to praise and grow closer to God. Worship each week includes song, prayer, learning, silence, and giving. Children participate fully in worship. We offer safe, quality childcare and quiet play for children five and under in our nursery. Reverend Jackson preaches every Sunday.

Beginning Epiphany Sunday, January 5, we begin a worship series based on *Won't You Be My Neighbor?*

There are few personalities who evoke such universal feelings of warmth as Presbyterian minister, Fred Rogers. An enduring presence in American homes for over 30 years, his plainspoken wisdom continues to guide and comfort many. Mister Rogers reminds us that there is much more in life that unites us than divides us. "I like you as you are, Exactly and precisely, I think you turned out nicely, And I like you as you are."

Fred Rogers fiercely believed that all people deserve love. This conviction wasn't simply sentimental: it came directly from his Christian faith. God, he insisted, loves us just the way we are. Throughout the months of January and February we will explore the wisdom and profound theology of Mr. Rogers.

EDUCATION FOR ALL. Church school and adult education classes are held every Sunday morning from September through late May. Children focus on Bible study and mission. Adult ed focuses on issues from Bible study to faith journeys to church history to current events to international conflicts. We also offer Theology on Tap on Monday evenings, Men's and Women's Forums and Women's Bible Study. Visit the churchs' website to learn more.

Mission. Our participation in Mission starts locally and expands around the world. We offer the Little Food Pantry, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Throughout the greater Chicago area, we support Pillars, the Constance Morris House, The Boulevard, The Presbytery of Chicago's Hunger Program. Internationally we support Mission Co-Workers in the Dominican Republic.
